ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- 1. The Dominican Republic (the **Borrower**) shall implement the "Dominican Republic Energy Efficiency and Rooftop Solar Project (P181424))" (the **Project**), with the involvement of the Ministry of Energy and Mines (MEM). The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (the **Bank**) has agreed to provide financing for the Project.
- 2. The Borrower shall ensure that the Project is carried out in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) of the Bank and this Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP), in a manner acceptable to the Bank. The ESCP is a part of the Legal Agreement. Unless otherwise defined in this ESCP, capitalized terms used in this ESCP have the meanings ascribed to them in the referred agreement.
- 3. Without limitation to the foregoing, this ESCP sets out material measures and actions that the Borrower shall carry out or cause to be carried out, including, as applicable, the timeframes of the actions and measures, institutional, staffing, training, monitoring and reporting arrangements, and grievance management. The ESCP also sets out the environmental and social (E&S) instruments that shall be adopted under the Project, all of which shall be subject to prior consultation and disclosure, consistent with the ESS, and in form and substance, and in a manner acceptable to the World Bank. Once adopted, said E&S instruments may be revised from time to time with prior written agreement by the Bank.
- 4. As agreed by the World Bank and the Borrower, this ESCP shall be revised from time to time, if necessary, during Project implementation, to reflect the adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to Project performance. In such circumstances, the Borrower and the Bank agree to update the ESCP to reflect these changes through an exchange of letters signed between the Bank and the MEM. The Borrower shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
